An **ISCC EU and PLUS Basic Training** will take place at the same venue on **February 20 – 22**. The Training will cover all topics relevant for ISCC certification. This includes:

- Implementation and verification of **deforestation-free supply chains**
- Upcoming **legislative and market developments**
- Requirements for **traceability and mass balance**
- Requirements for **greenhouse gas calculations**.

The participation in the ISCC EU and PLUS Basic Training is a mandatory requirement for all auditors before they can conduct audits under ISCC. Participation is also recommended to ISCC System Users and companies preparing for ISCC certification.
